-We put a down payment down on a Type 3 Wildland Engine that ticks all the essential boxes and most of our desirable boxes. Marc and Tom will be flying out to Sacramento next week to inspect it and drive it home.

-We received and trained on the new monitors (Tempus Pro). We are waiting on new mounts so we can put them in the ambulances.

-We received and trained with our new ROSC-U CPR device. It is now on Medic 386.

-Medic 386 is back in service after a warranty repair that took it out of service for about three weeks.

-Lighting- Voltking Electric came in last year at \$5,687, but unfortunately we had to divert that money to a new furnace and hot water heater. I'd like to do this project this year if possible.

-The new engine hunt took away time I was hoping to complete the new reserve member policy on. I hope to complete it in February.

We were paid for the Cameron Peak and Pine Gulch fires. The district made about \$21,000 on these two assignments.
